# WHAT IS A BILL?

---

- A bill is a formal, written legal document introduced by a member of the General Assembly to change the law.
- The term “bill” refers to the document from the time it is drafted and delivered to the member until it is considered and passed by both the House and the Senate.
- After being enacted (passed) by the General Assembly, the bill becomes an “act.”

# HOW DOES A BILL CHANGE THE LAW?

---

Bills propose changes to Ohio law by doing any of the following:

- Amending (changing) existing provisions of law;
- Enacting new provisions of law;
- Repealing (eliminating) provisions of law.

- Legislator
- Constituents
- Administrative departments (executive branch)
- Other states' legislation
- Lobbyists
- Changes in federal law
- National organizations
- News of the day

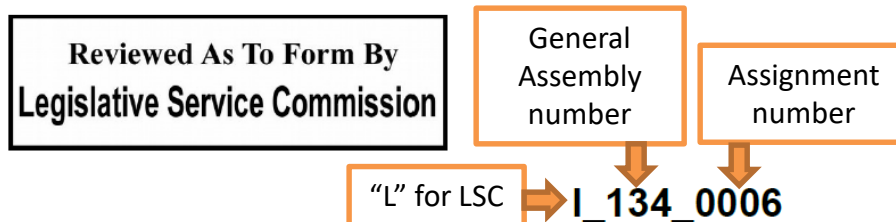
# IDEA → DOCUMENT

---

- A member or the member's staff can ask LSC to draft a bill.
- LSC works with the member's office to put the member's policy ideas into a bill draft.
- Once finished, LSC will send the member a bill draft in the form of an "L-number bill draft."
- LSC keeps each bill draft confidential through the drafting process until it is introduced.

# L-NUMBER FOR BILLS

- Each LSC bill draft has a unique tracking number at the top.
  - If the requestor asks for changes to the draft, LSC will give the draft the same number, but add “-1,” “-2,” or “-3.” For example, I\_134\_0006-5 would be the sixth version of the bill draft. This is called a “dash version.”
- A bill draft can only be introduced once. If a member wishes to introduce the same bill in the other chamber (a companion bill), the member’s office must ask LSC to produce a copy with a different number.

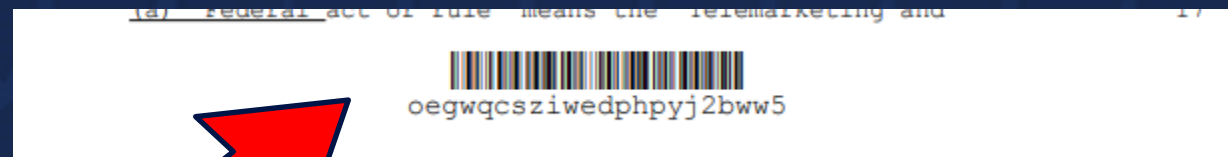
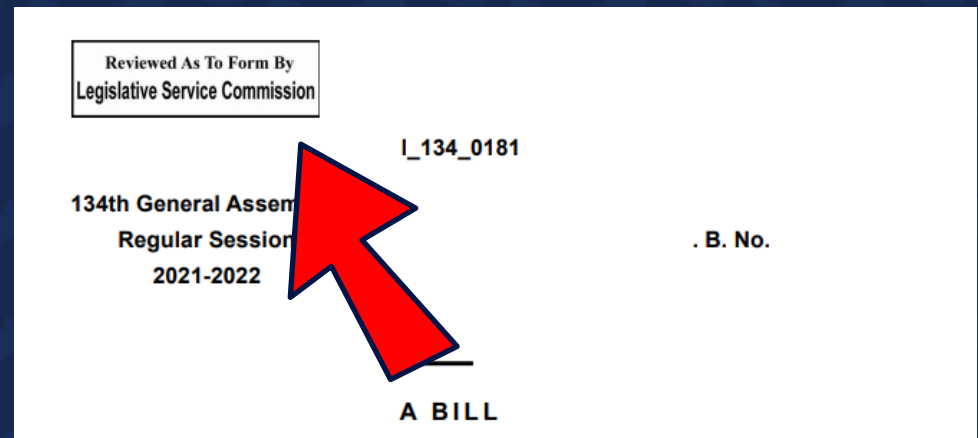

- Each bill draft must have:
  - LSC review stamp in upper left corner
  - A bar code, enabling the Clerk to scan the bill draft for introduction

# BILL NUMBER

- When a bill is filed with the Clerk, the Clerk assigns it a bill number.
  - H.B. = House Bill
  - S.B. = Senate Bill
- Bills are numbered in the order they are received.
- A bill keeps its number throughout that General Assembly.
- If the bill is reintroduced in a future General Assembly, it will have a different number.

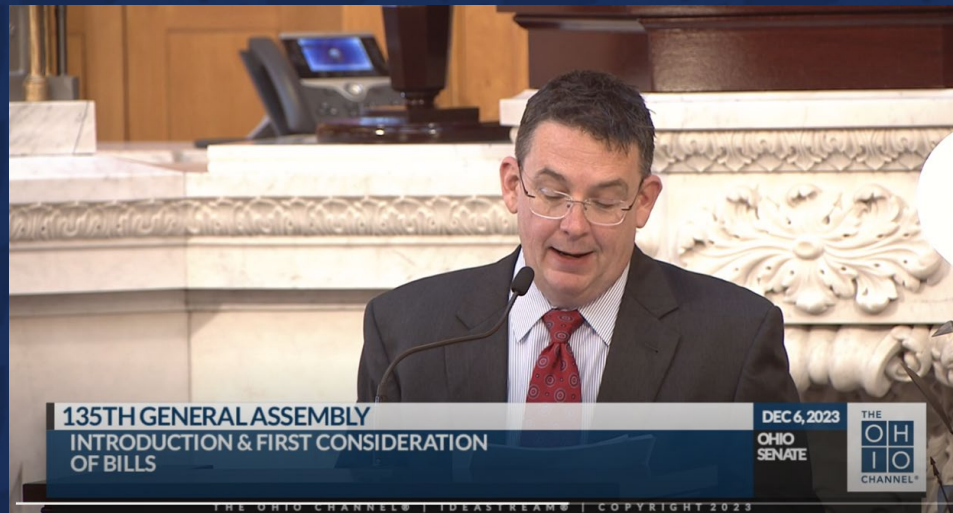

# INTRODUCTION AT SESSION

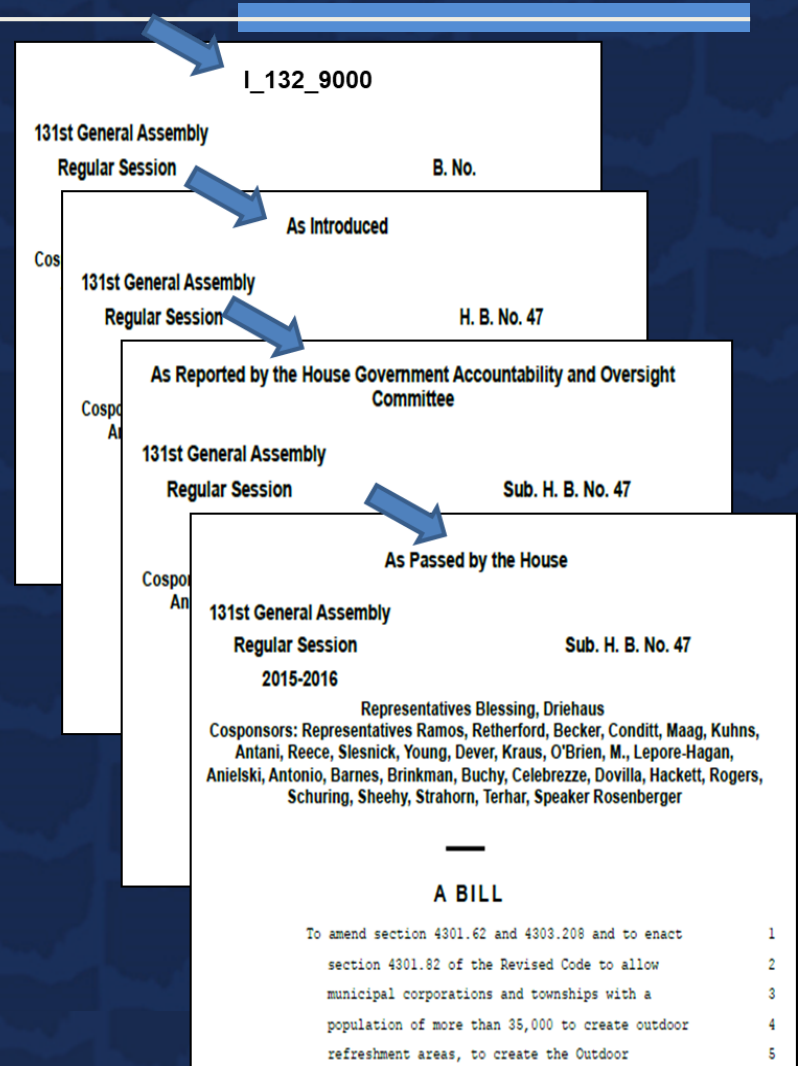
---

- A bill is officially introduced during floor session.
- This is the bill's “first consideration” for purposes of the constitutional requirement that each bill be considered three times.



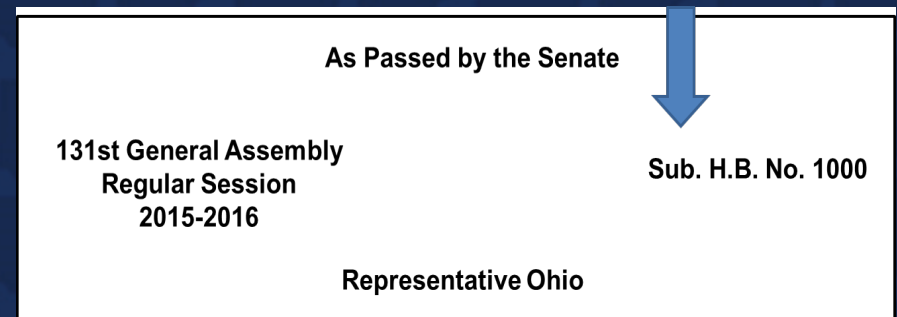
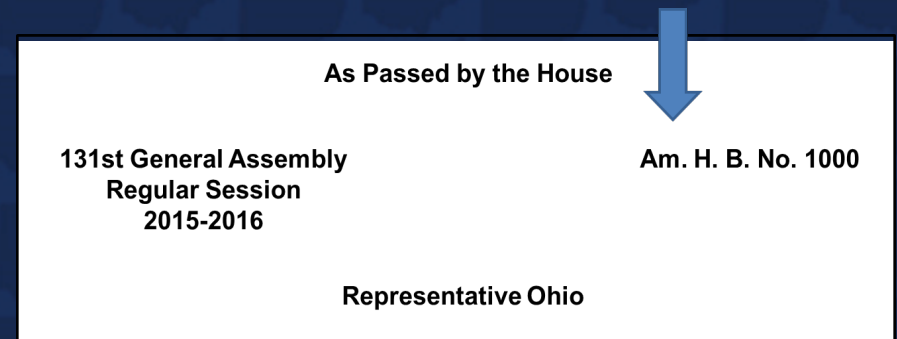
# BILL VERSION

- The Clerk also replaces the L-number header with “As Introduced.”
- The bill version is updated throughout the legislative process.
- Make sure you’re looking at the most recent version of a bill! Contents and line numbers may change with each version.



# AMENDED AND SUBSTITUTE BILLS

- If a bill is changed after introduction, “Am.” or “Sub.” is added to the bill number.
  - Am. = Amended Bill
  - Sub. = Substitute Bill
- An amended bill has had changes made to it in committee or on the floor through the adoption of amendments.
- A substitute bill has had changes made to it in committee – usually a larger number of changes.



# BILL SPONSORS

- The member who submits a bill for introduction is the bill's primary sponsor. Two members may be joint sponsors of a bill.
- Often, the primary sponsor(s) will ask other legislators to be cosponsors. Cosponsors may be added throughout the legislative process.
- When a bill reaches the second house, the first member of the second house who is listed as a cosponsor is often considered to be "carrying" the bill in the second house.

# BILL TITLE – AFFECTED STATUTES

The title includes a list of every section of the Ohio Revised Code that the bill amends, enacts, or repeals.

# BILL TITLE – DESCRIPTION OF CONTENT

---

The title also includes a brief description of the bill's content. This is required under Article II, Section 15 of the Ohio Constitution.

# ADDITIONAL TITLE REQUIREMENTS

---

The title description must say so if the bill does any of the following:

- Imposes a tax
- Includes an appropriation
- Declares an emergency

# STYLE CLAUSE

---

The style clause follows the bill's title.

Article II, Section 15 of the Ohio Constitution requires every bill to have the style clause.

# BILL BODY

- Unlike federal legislation, an Ohio bill must include the full text of all affected Revised Code sections, as required by the Ohio Constitution.
- Sections appear in numerical order, not organized by subject matter.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

# SECTIONS OF A BILL

- Bills are divided into parts called sections
- The word “section” is spelled out - Section 1, Section 2, etc.
- Revised Code sections, on the other hand, are marked with an abbreviated “Sec.” before the section number.
- Uncodified language also appears in bill sections (at the end of the bill)

# ENACTING CLAUSE

---

- Section 1 of a bill is usually the enacting clause.
- This clause lists the sections of the Revised Code that the bill amends or enacts.

# ENACTING NEW R.C. SECTIONS

When a bill enacts a new R.C. section, the text of the entire section, including the section number, is underlined.

# TYPES OF REPEAL CLAUSES

<b>Section 2.</b> That <b>existing</b> section 1547.30 of the Revised Code is hereby repealed.	313 314
<b>Section 3.</b> That sections 4585.31, 4585.32, 4585.33, and 4585.34 of the Revised Code are hereby repealed.	315 316

- When a bill **amends** an R.C. section, it includes a repeal clause that repeals the “**existing**” version of that R.C. section. (Section 2 above)
- When a bill **repeals** an R.C. section outright – meaning it is being eliminated from the law – it includes a repeal clause that does not use the word “existing.” (Section 3 above)

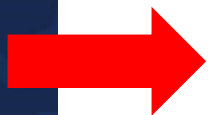


# OUTRIGHT REPEALS

- When a bill repeals an R.C. section outright, the text of the section is not included in the bill.
- How do I know what's being repealed?
  - Look at the title or the repeal clause to identify the R.C. sections being repealed.
  - Look up the sections using [codes.ohio.gov](http://codes.ohio.gov).

# UNCODIFIED LAW

---

- Uncodified sections of law appear as sections of the bill (Section 3, Section 4, etc.), not as Revised Code sections.
- These usually appear at the end of the bill, after any amended or enacted R.C. sections.

**Section 4.** The Director of Agriculture shall establish appropriate procedures for renewing the registration of a person operating as an animal rescue for dogs under section 956.06 of the Revised Code who was so registered prior to the effective date of this section. The procedures shall include an appropriate time within which the person shall renew the registration, which shall not be later than two hundred seventy-five days after the effective date of this section.

Special law (not of general application), such as a grant of state-owned land

**Section 753.20.** (A) The Governor may execute a deed in the name of the state ("grantor") conveying to the City of Toledo or to a grantee to be determined, and to the grantee's heirs and assigns or successors and assigns, all of the state's right, title, and interest in the following described real estate:

Situate in the City of Toledo, County of Lucas, State of Ohio:

All of Lots Number 1051, 1052 and 1053 AND All of Lots 1057, 1058, 1059, and 1409½ in the VISTULA DIVISION in the CITY OF TOLEDO, LUCAS COUNTY, OHIO.

# EXAMPLES OF UNCODIFIED LAW

---

## Emergency clause

**Section 3.** This act is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety. The reason for such necessity is that boaters using the waters of this state urgently need the support and protection afforded by this act during the current boating season. Therefore, this act shall go into immediate effect.

---



# WHAT IS AN AMENDMENT?

---

- An amendment is a formal document that proposes changes to a bill.
- It provides a set of instructions that indicate where in the bill the changes should be made and what those changes should be.

# HOW ARE AMENDMENTS USED?

---

- LSC drafts amendments at the request of a legislator or the legislator's staff.
  - An amendment might change the operation of a bill or add provisions to it.
  - An amendment also might correct a technical error.
- Only legislators who serve on a committee may offer an amendment to a bill being heard by that committee.
- Any legislator may offer an amendment to a bill while it is being considered on the floor.



# PARTS OF AN AMENDMENT

- Legislators refer to an amendment by its **amendment number**.
- The amendment must be drafted to the current **version of the bill**. For the amendment to be offered again later in the process, LSC must redraft it.
- **Line commands** refer to the line of the bill where the change is to occur.
- LSC includes a brief **synopsis** of each amendment.

# AMENDMENT VOCABULARY

---

- **Insert** – add new language or sections of law
  - After line 32, insert:  
“This is new language being added to an R.C. section.”
- **Delete** – remove language from the bill
  - In line 57, delete “five” and insert “three”
- **Strike through** – strike through language that is current law
  - In line 13, strike through “director” and insert “deputy director”
- **Reinsert** – restore (un-strike) current law language in the bill
  - In line 82, reinsert “free” and delete “for a fee”

# AMENDMENTS VS SUBSTITUTE BILLS

---

- While a bill is in committee, a member may offer a substitute version of the bill (“sub bill”) instead of offering an amendment.
- A sub bill is a new version of the bill with all the proposed changes included in it.
- When many changes are proposed, a sub bill can be easier to read than an amendment.
- If a committee adopts several amendments to a bill, it will usually be reported as a substitute bill.



Line numbers appear in the right-hand margin and are used to locate text within the bill.

Line numbers are especially important for purposes of amendments to the bill.

The committee reports the bill and the bill is scheduled for a floor vote.

The legislator may offer the same amendment during floor session.
